Overall conclusions:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All pupils in Owls' Class are satisfied with the school. • The vast majority of pupils agree that they are learning a lot at this school and that they have to work hard. • The vast majority of pupils agree that there are high expectations for behaviour within the school and a clear majority believe that teachers are fair if rules are broken. • All pupils agree that there is an adult they would go to if they are worried or hurt and a clear majority feel safe at school. • Teaching staff are demonstrating to pupils how to make their learning better. • It is clear from the comments that pupils are enjoying a wide range of curriculum areas and enrichments introduced this year, e.g. Wild Tribe. • Pupils enjoy the lunch choices and are enjoying an active lunchtime with three activities provided, e.g. 'Wheellie Fun Fridays'.
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Next steps:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adults in Owls' class to develop approaches in teaching to allow pupils to work more independently in their learning and have strategies for when they get 'stuck' in their learning. • Celebrate challenge in learning so that pupils understand that challenge and hard work is a sign of a good learner. • Continue to develop curriculum enrichments and a range of after school clubs. • Ensure all pupils at some point have a job/responsibility so they have an opportunity to prove they are trusted to carry out roles on their own/in pairs. • Review the homework sent out in Owls' class and raise the profile of it. Ensure that it is celebrated and displayed during topic showcases.
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
